If it be according to Your Will, for the honor and glory of the Most Holy Trinity and for the salvation of souls, we ask You to move the Church to proclaim him a

Saintly Status

On September 14, 2002, the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome, Italy, gave permission to Bishop Daniel Jenky, CSC of Peoria, Illinois, to officially open the cause for canonization of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. (Archbishop Sheen was born, raised and later ordained to serve as a priest in that diocese.) As a result, he is now referred to as "Servant of God." In the summer of 2006, documentation of two alleged miracles attributed to the Archbishop was sent to Rome, furthering the cause for his canonization. In February 2008, a Mass in Peoria, at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception, celebrated the end of the diocesan phase of the inquiry into the life and works of Archbishop Sheen.
